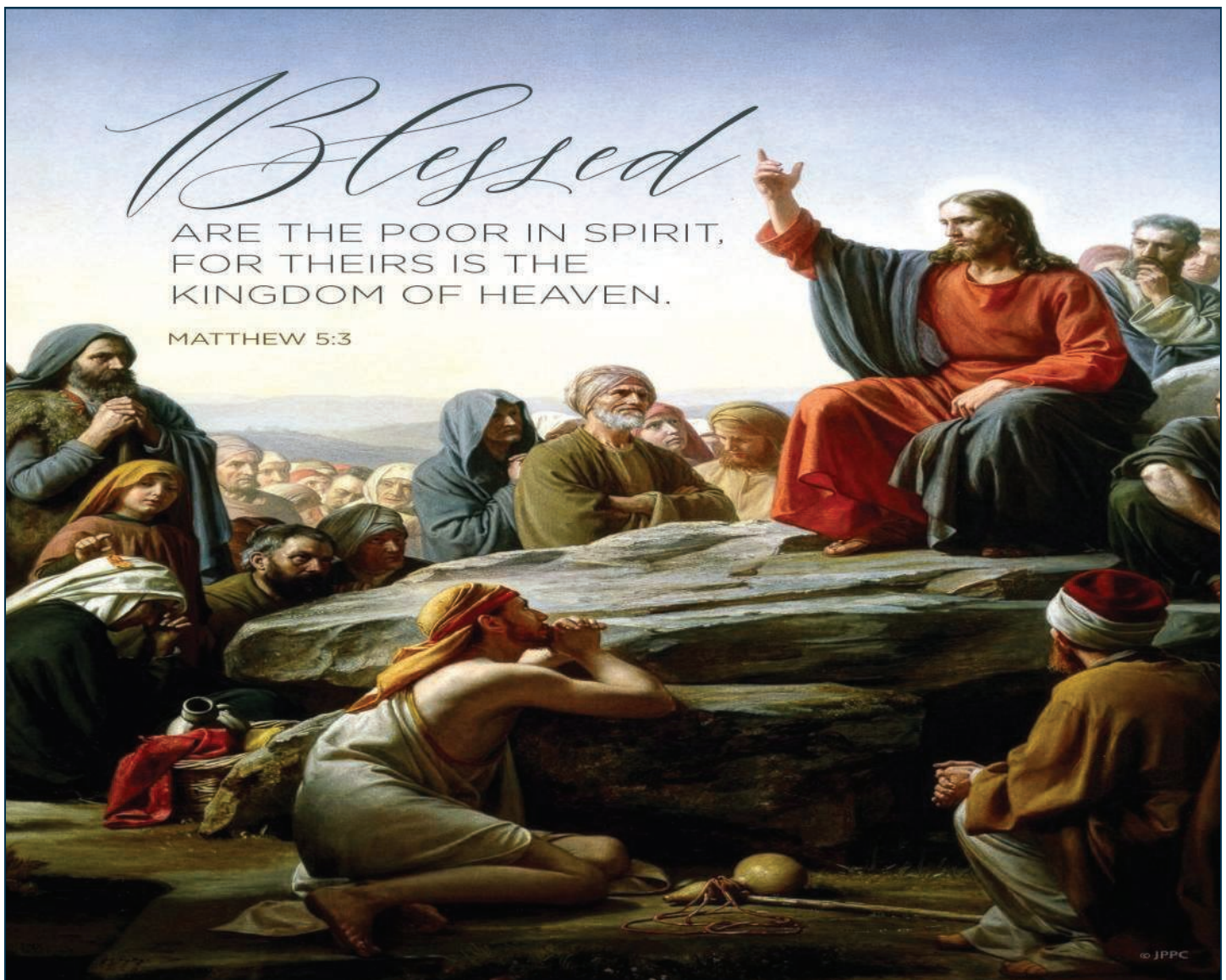

The Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

When I talked to the children in faith formation I sometimes asked them what Jesus' religion was. Once they figured out what "religion" meant, they confidently identified him as a Catholic. After more conversation, it was a great surprise for them to discover that Jesus wasn't Catholic and that he never even prayed the rosary! They learned that Jesus was Jewish, as were his parents, friends, and disciples.

As Catholic adults, we are regularly exposed to the Jewishness of Jesus through the readings provided in our Lectionary. During most of the year, except for primarily the Easter season, the first reading is taken from the Old Testament and it helps us to better see the unfolding of God's plan and its culmination in Jesus. These readings are always related thematically to the Gospel. Sometimes they foreshadow or parallel events in the gospels. Sometimes they provide examples of a "type" or model of what we see in the New Testament. I think understanding this can give us a richer appreciation of Jesus' teaching in today's readings.

In the first reading, the prophet Zephaniah urges the Israelites to seek justice and humility as the only way to protect themselves from the coming day of the Lord: "perhaps you may be sheltered on the day of the Lord's anger." These words continue a long history of exhortations from the prophets who urged and pleaded with the people of Israel to listen to the voice of the Lord, to trust in God's power, not their own judgement or the strength of foreign entities. Writing around the same time period, the prophet Jeremiah echoes these sentiments, decrying the people's determined movement away from God. He identifies a hardness about them, born of their pride, that makes them almost incapable of following God's ways. Jeremiah describes their faces as stony (5:3), their hearts, stubborn and rebellious (5:23). Every man walks in "the hardness of his evil heart, instead of listening to me" (16:12).

The warnings of the prophets were sadly fulfilled. Once a united and flourishing kingdom, Israel soon lost its way, first by a division between the North and South and then, the destruction of the northern kingdom by the Assyrians. Later, the southern kingdom of Judah was conquered by the Babylonian Empire, its citizens killed or sent into exile. Approximately seventy years later, a new power, the Persian King Cyrus, allowed them to return to their homeland. A smaller, more faithful community emerged, rebuilding the Temple and renewing their commitment to the Mosaic law.

So it was not *just* the dire warnings of the prophets that were fulfilled. Their messages were also usually accompanied by words of hope as we see today in Zephaniah: "But I will leave as a remnant in your midst a people humble and lowly, who shall take refuge in the name of the LORD: the remnant of Israel." Despite the faithlessness of Israel, there would be some, forged in the failure, who would be strong and wise enough to live with humility. These people would be able to hear God's voice and follow God's ways, not bending to foreign gods or earthy kings. Many of the returning exiles embodied that prophecy.

Jesus would have grown up knowing this history, knowing the prophets warnings but also well aware of the hope they proclaimed. And he would have known well the people who sat before him, not most by name, but certainly by shared experiences. The crowd that listened to Jesus teachings in today's gospel lived under Roman occupation, the latest of the outside powers that had controlled their lives. They had very little agency, very little hope of any return to the kingdom of the past. They were a far cry from the prideful people that the prophets spoke to and very far from the prevailing values of the Roman Empire. They were the poor, the mournful, the meek, the dreaming of a peace filled life. And Jesus told them that being thus was a blessing because it enabled them to hear God's voice and walk in God's ways, just what the prophets had pleaded for all those years ago.

Perhaps some of those in the crowd resisted the idea of being a people humble and lowly. We know there were some who were hoping for a Messiah to reestablish Israel's earthly kingdom. And probably others still wanted to rely on themselves rather than their God. Jesus could reinforce the prophets' message but, as was always the case in Israel's history, listening to and accepting God's ways was a personal decision.

And that is what we need to reflect upon today for our own lives. When we hear the Beatitudes what do we hear? Or rather, *can* we even hear their message? Can we hear Jesus amidst the cacophony of the rough and mean noises that come from our world? Can we hear him say that God's values are the only way to happiness? Or do we resist the idea of being humble because we like to be right, because we think we have all the answers? At Jesus' baptism, the bystanders heard God's voice: "This is my beloved Son, listen to him." Let us work to develop hearts open to listening and open to guidance. It's what God has always asked of us.

A Screening of the T.A.M.I. Show

The Most Acclaimed Rock Concert Most People Have Never Seen

1964 was a momentous year for Rock 'n' Roll. Its founding fathers were still in their prime, even as new stars burst on the scene from all over: Motown; California surf sound; the "British Invasion"; and James Brown laying the foundation for modern Soul, Funk, and Rhythm and Blues. It was a time for a project like T.A.M.I. (Teenage Music Awards International). The concept: gather artists from every realm of Rock for an annual all-star concert. Money raised from the live concert and theatrical release of its filmed recording would fund music scholarships for the world's teenagers.

The concert, filmed at the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium on October 29, 1964, was an enormous artistic success but, alas, a business disaster. The first concert was the last. Tied up in litigation for decades, the film simply disappeared for anyone who attended neither the concert nor a theatrical showing. Portions of the legendary performances (Chuck Berry, Smokey Robinson & the Miracles, Marvin Gaye, the Supremes, Beach Boys, Jan & Dean, Gerry & the Pacemakers, the Rolling Stones, Lesley Gore, James Brown) became bootleg icons. It took 45 years for the legal hurdles to be resolved, making the DVD we will view possible. Every amazing performance is live (no lip-synching) backed by an orchestra that would later be known as The Wrecking Crew. The video and the audio are remarkably good. Anyone interested in where modern rock and popular music came from will have a blast watching this together.

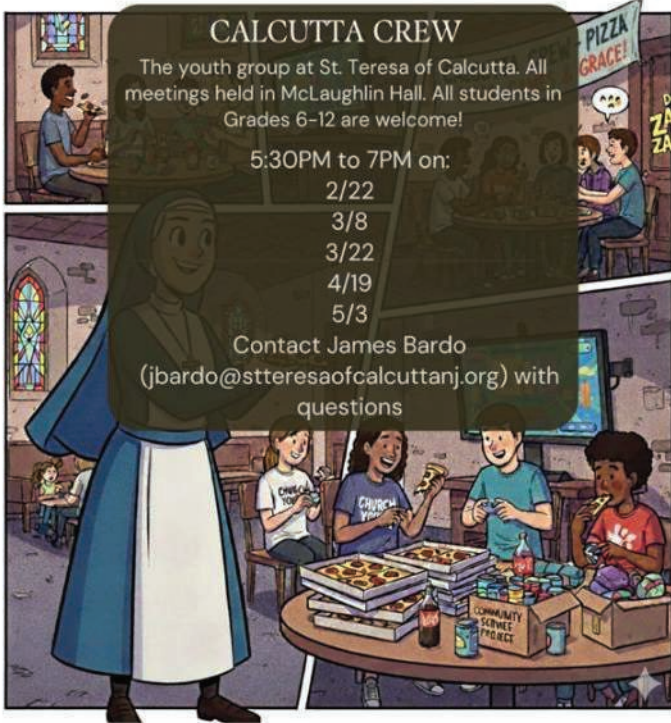

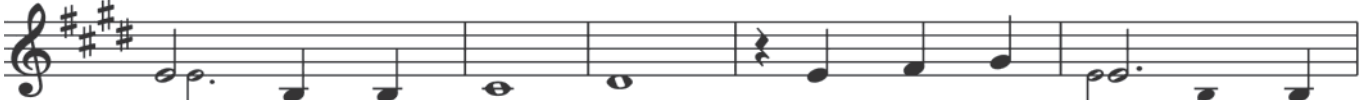
