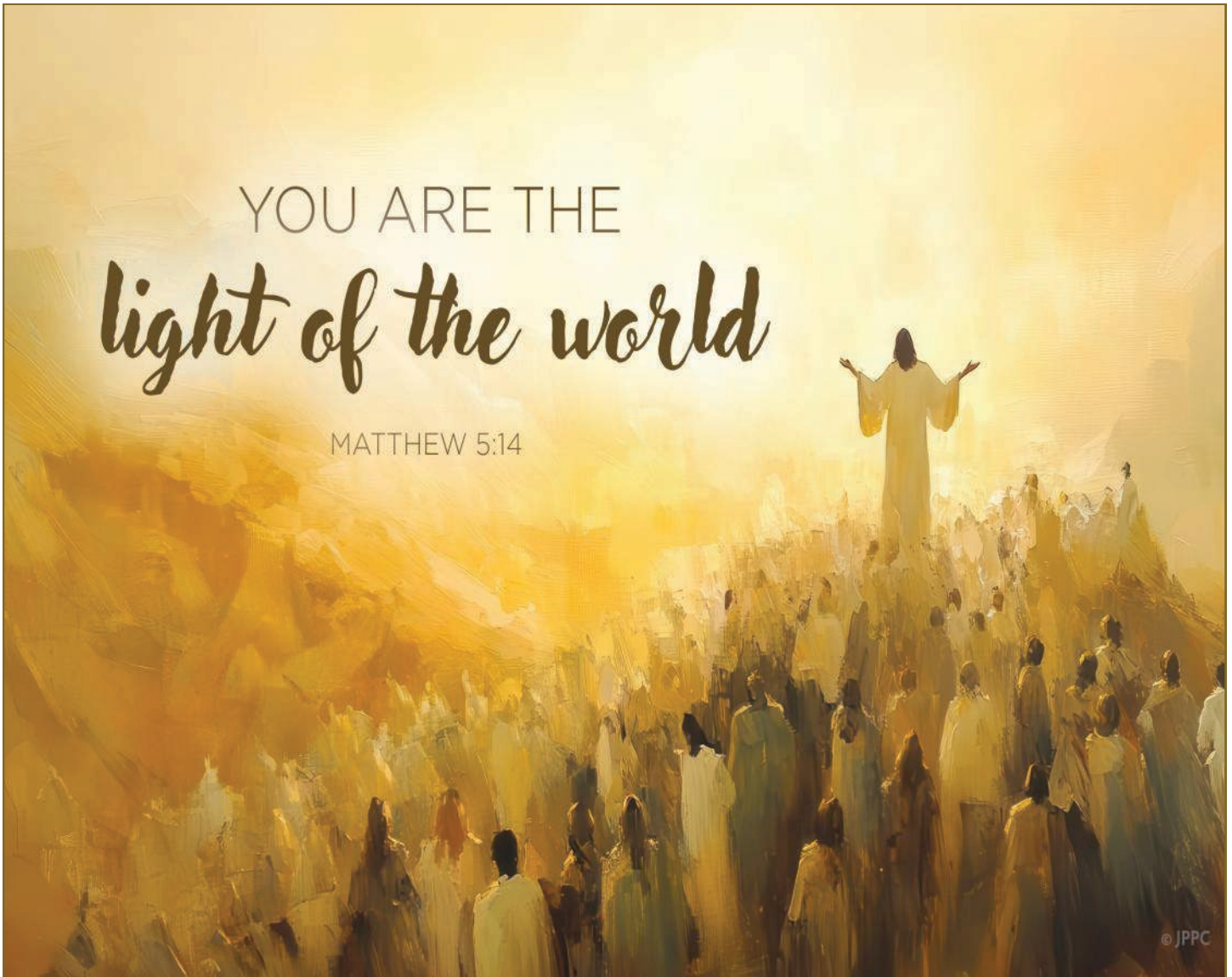

The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection by Deacon Leo Howitz

Today's reflection is from the Gospel of Matthew; Jesus calls his disciples the salt of the earth. What exactly does that mean? Well, it's not as obvious as you might think. We know that salt adds flavor to a meal and without salt food can be kind of bland. But to the Jewish people it means a little bit more. If we go back to the Old Testament Leviticus, salt was always added to a Sacrifice in the Temple.

So, salt with respect to the Covenant with God and the Jewish people creates a different dimension. Jesus calls his disciples the salt of the earth and if we look at Saint Paul, he referred to the people of his churches as living sacrifices. So, there is a very mysterious aspect between the disciples and salt.

Jesus adds a warning to this also. He tells his disciples if they lose their saltiness, it is good for nothing; might as well throw it out. Well, salt cannot change from being salt, but it could be diluted in water or adulterated to taste a little different by adding various spices.

What else was it used for in the ancient world? It was used to preserve food from going bad since they did not have refrigeration. So, here is my take on this and I may be wrong. The disciples believed in Jesus and Jesus was showing them amazing things, healing all kinds of illnesses, feeding the multitudes, and changing water into wine. He was teaching them about how they should live and about His relationship with His Heavenly Father.

Jesus was teaching them very important things and one of their jobs would be to preserve these teachings for future generations. Jesus knew people could easily misunderstand who He is after the resurrection and He was right. Think of the different heresies that came to be in the first five hundred years of the faith.

The Holy Spirit was definitely at work through them and with the Gospel writers in the very early days of Christianity. Everything Jesus taught was preserved intact exactly how He intended. The other warning Jesus gave them about losing their saltiness was the fear that the faith could be diluted by the distractions of the world.

The other aspect we hear in this Gospel is light. The salt of the earth and the light of the world. Jesus called Himself the light of the world. Later what did Jesus' call those who believed in Him? They also were called lights for the world. Through Jesus and our baptism into the faith we also are united with Jesus in the Mystical Body of Christ. Just as Jesus is the light of the world, we also are called to be the same thing.

For us today how do we become the salt of the earth and the light of the world? Look to the saints. I spoke about Father Damian of Molokai before, and he is a perfect example. He was a priest from a very poor, humble farming village in Belgium.

The salt that he added to the Church was the work that he did in the Hawaiian Leprosy village of Molokai. No one wanted to go there because it was a leper colony. They lived in very poor, unsanitary conditions, and no one cared for them at all. For all intents and purposes, they were there to die from their disease.

Damian somehow found himself there and, out of love for them, stayed with them for the rest of his life. He could have come home but decided to stay with them because they needed him. God always moves people exactly where he needs them. Being born and raised in a farming village prepared him to teach these people how to farm and provide for themselves.

That was the salt he brought to their world. He showed them how to survive and gave them hope that although they lived in this colony, they could exist almost self-sufficient and that Jesus was always with them and loved them.

The light Father Damian brought to the world was that he decided to stay with these people even though he did not have the disease. He lived with them and maybe it was only a matter of time, but he later became one with them, sharing the disease, living and dying as one of them.

The Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

FIRST READING:

Isaiah 58:7-10

Thus says the LORD: Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own. Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your wound shall quickly be healed; your vindication shall go before you, and the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer, you shall cry for help, and he will say: Here I am! If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech; if you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday.

SECOND READING:

1 Corinthians 2:1-5

Encourage your loved ones and friends to be an altar server or lector, to serve in parish ministries, and to assist in teaching the faith to God's people. 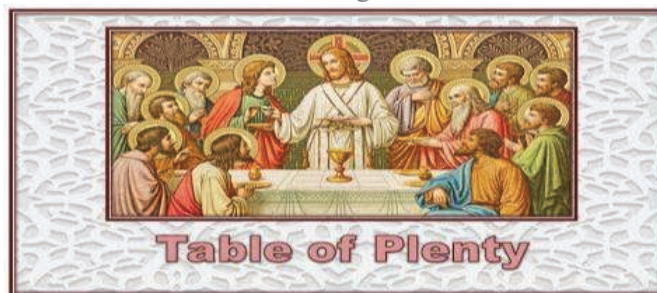

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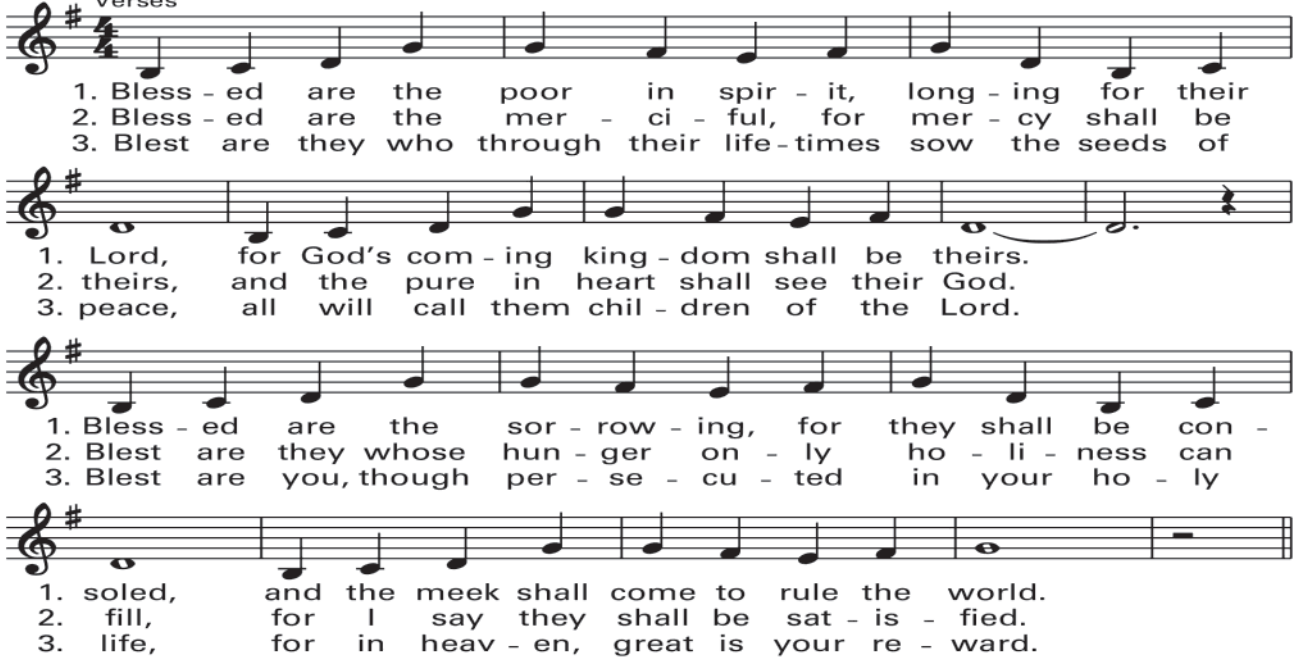
