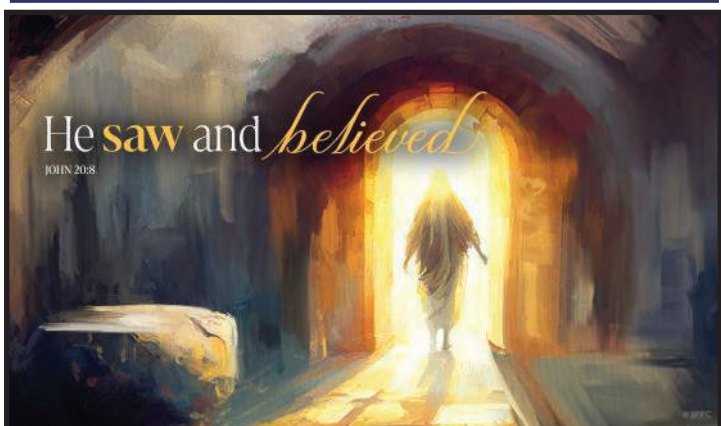

Reflection The Resurrection of the Lord—Mass of Easter Sunday

Reflection by Fr Bertonazzi

One of the great devotions of the Catholic Church is the praying of the Rosary. In each mystery of the rosary there is a fruit associated with it and as you pray the rosary this fruit should become more evident in your life. The first Glorious Mystery is The Resurrection and the fruit associated with it is Faith.

We see that Faith in the Gospel today as we are told of the immediate aftermath of Jesus' resurrection. Peter and John run to the tomb and not seeing Jesus they do not understand what has happened. We were told that they both went into the tomb but only John saw and believed it at that moment.

In our reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we are told that Peter now is preaching the resurrection of Christ with boldness. He is preaching Christ as the savior of the world and that they are witnesses who ate and drank with him after the resurrection. He has come to believe and is now testifying that Jesus is alive!

Brothers and sisters, you and I are called to believe that Jesus is alive. We were not there at the time in the same way as the Apostles, yet we are here at Mass in the presence of Christ's Eucharistic presence where we eat and drink with him. We are called to witness to the power of The Resurrection in our own lives, his power over death.

Jesus' resurrection should shine through our own lives, so that we have faith amidst the trials that we experience.

We are raised with Christ in Baptism, and we are called to seek what is above. In our life here we live with eyes fixed to heaven, not on earthly things.

Let us rejoice and be glad in Jesus' resurrection and bring that same hope to others.

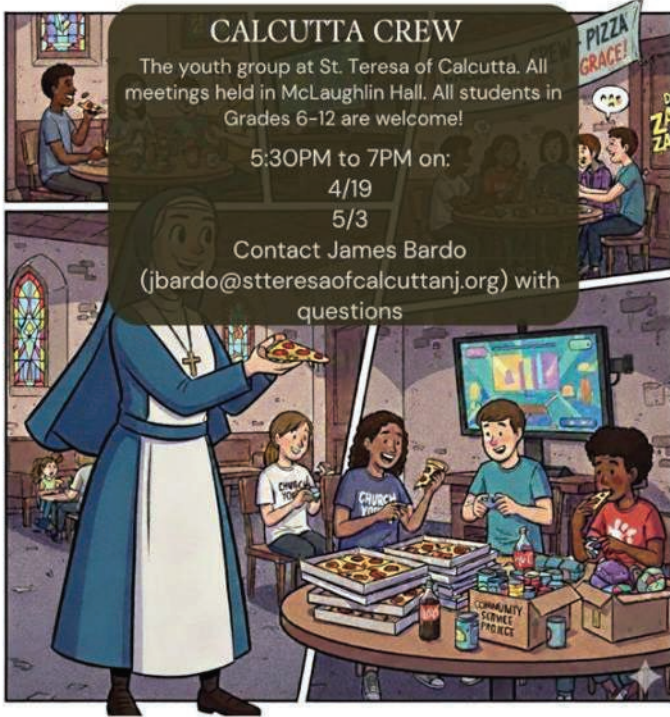

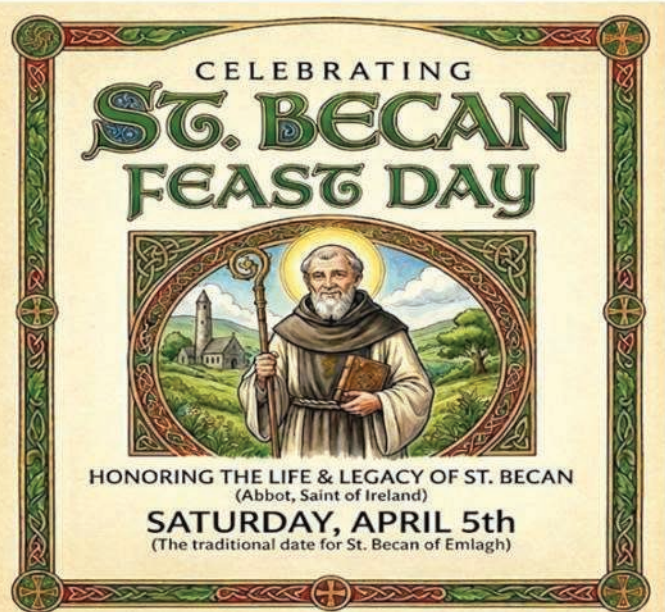

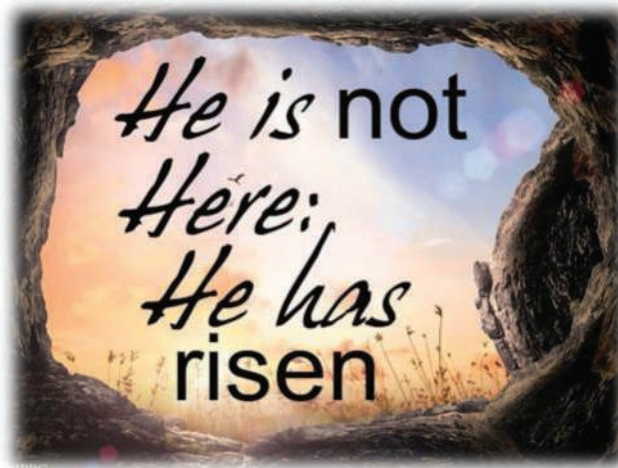
